Palermo, Sicily, 1978. The Christian Democrat leader Aldo Moro has just been kidnapped in Rome by members of the notorious Red Brigades. Two months after his disappearance on 9th May, Moro is found dead in the boot of a car. A trio of eleven-year-old schoolboys, Nimbo, Raggio, and Volo, avidly follow the news of the abduction as their admiration for the brigatisti grows. When the boys themselves resolve to abduct a classmate and incarcerate him in a makeshift 'people's prison', the darkness within their world, and the world of the novel, becomes all-pervasive. Nell'immagine del campanile di Amatrice, Tetti sorge un mondo ben più vasto, che va anch'esso inesorabilmente franando. Mentre i grandi agglomerati urbani si preparano a ospitare la gran parte della popolazione mondiale, interi territori si popolano. E lo spopolamento è la cifra delle aree interne di numerose regioni d'Italia ed Europa. Di fronte a questo scenario, l'antropologo coglie l'abbandono come la forma culturale dello spopolamento e si chiede: cosa fare dei segni del passato, delle schegge di un universo esploso? Nella prospettiva di Tetti, il passato può e deve essere riscattato come un mondo sommerso di potenzialità suscettibili di future realizzazioni. In aggiutto, certo, c'è il rischio che la retorica e la nostalgia restituiscano quel poco che, del paese, resta. Viceversa, la nostalgia positiva, costruita può essere sostegno a innovazione, inclusione e mutamento. Se la nostalgia diventa una strategia per inventare il paese, allora quel che resta è ancora moltissimo. L'antropologia dell'abbandono e del ritorno, di cui Tetti definisce in queste pagine i tratti essenziali, è un tentativo d'interpretazione dei luoghi a partire da quel che resta, e che occorre ascoltare, prendendosene cura. Come scrive Claudio Magris nella prefazione: «In questo libro di scienza e di poesia c'è una profonda partecipazione al destino nomade e ramingo non solo degli emigranti partiti con le loro povere cose, ma di ognuno, delle stesse civiltà, del loro nascere e passare, ma forse mai definitivamente».

The essence of art is to conceal art. A dancer or musician does not only need to perform with ability. There should also be a lack of visible effort that gives an impression of naturalness. To disguise technique and feign ease is to heighten beauty. To express this notion, Italian has a word with no exact equivalent in other languages, sprezzatura: a kind of unaffectedness or nonchalance. In this book, the first to consider sprezzatura in its own right, philosopher of art Paolo D'Angelo reconstructs the history of concealing art, from ancient rhetoric to our own times. The word sprezzatura was coined in 1528 by Baldassare Castiglione in *The Book of the Courier* to mean a kind of grace with a special essence: the ability to conceal art. But the idea reaches back to Aristotle and Cicero and forward to avant-garde works such as Duchamp's ready-mades, all of which share the suspicion of the overt display of skill. The precept that art must be hidden turns up in a number of fields, from cosmetics to interior design, politics to poetry, the English garden to shabby chic. Through exploring different articulations of this idea, D'Angelo shows the paradox of aesthetics: art hides that it is art, but in doing so it reveals itself to be art and becomes an assertion about art. When art is concealed, it appears as spontaneous as nature—yet, paradoxically, also reveals its indebtedness to technique. An erudite and surprising tour through aesthetics, philosophy, and art history, Sprezzatura presents a strikingly original argument with deceptive ease.
