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Surrounding wound edges can become macerated because of the moisture contained in the dressing, and that can lead to enlargement of the wound's

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diameter. Cross-contamination is also an issue as the saturated gauze in wet-to-dry dressings does not provide any barrier to the environment, thus allowing organisms in and out of the wound easily.
