Stephen Vincent Ben é t was born on 22nd July 1898 in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, United States. Ben é t was an accomplished writer at an early age, having had his first book published at 17 and submitting his third volume of poetry in lieu of a thesis for his degree.
