Historic Preservation Design Guidelines | SF Planning

The Historic Resource Design Guidelines are intended to be a tool and resource for property owners, design professionals, contractors, the Historic Landmarks Commission, Planning Commission and the City Council of Santa Barbara, and should enable people to make more informed decisions about the City's historic resources. The goal of the Guidelines is to protect the historical and architectural integrity of significant historic structures and landscapes in Santa Barbara.

Design Guidelines for Preservation Commissions

The Historic Design Guidelines provide historic district residents, property owners, professionals working with historic properties, and potential construction applicants a background history of the City's historic districts, an understanding of architectural design principles, and guidelines which promote predictability and ensure compatibility between new development and the existing historic environment.

Design Guidelines for Historic Districts Design guidelines are locally developed criteria which assist property owners, developers, architects, and others in making decisions about the appropriate treatment of historic resources when planning repair, rehabilitation, restoration, landscape, or new construction projects.

Historic Design Guidelines In considering whether to recommend approval or disapproval of an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness, the HDRC is guided by the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation, the City of San Antonio's Unified Development Code, and any additional design guidelines adopted by City Council, such as the Historic Design Guidelines and the Downtown Design Guide.

The HPC created Design Guidelines for the Glen Ridge Historic District to codify the long-standing design principles utilized in the review and approval of renovations, repairs, and expansion of properties in Glen Ridge. Funded by a grant from the New Jersey Historic Preservation Office and the National Park Service, these guidelines provide an easy-to-use reference document for residents, architects, and contractors to plan projects and facilitate the HPCs design review process. The Design Guidelines are intended to further the appreciation of the architecture, setting, and history of Glen Ridge, to help ensure consistency in local decision-making, and to benefit property owners by clarifying community expectations. These Design Guidelines offer information on the rehabilitation of existing buildings, including new additions and new construction, to offer a common body of knowledge for all participants in the review process, including Commission members. The HPC recognized that applying design guidelines is often challenging, especially in Glen Ridge, where there is so much variety in the architecture. These Design Guidelines are intended to codify the objective basis for the HPC's decisions and help increase public awareness of historically appropriate design. However, the Design Guidelines do not offer all of the answers or solutions to a homeowner or design team as good architectural design cannot be achieved only by applying a set of rules. The challenge for both the homeowner and the HPC member is knowing how to apply the Design Guidelines to make sound judgments that will help preserve the architectural character of Glen Ridge while also allowing expressions of change and adaptation.

This document provides guidance for improvements to historic properties and work within designated historic districts in Anderson, South Carolina. The guidelines are for property owners planning exterior alterations, additions or demolition to existing buildings. They also apply to the design of new buildings within the historic districts. The guidelines will be used by the City's Board of Architectural Review (BAR) when making decisions about granting approval to exterior alterations and additions to structures and to proposed new construction and demolition in the districts. The guidelines are not a rigid set of rules, but they do serve as criteria for determining appropriateness of alterations. They also provide educational information to property owners and tenants about historic buildings, their distinctive characteristics and how to maintain them; they suggest various appropriate ways to address design, repair and rehabilitation issues; and, they suggest good maintenance practices. - Introduction.

This collection of papers addresses two questions central to design and historic preservation: what are the parameters of 'compatibility' in the design of additions to historic buildings and of new infill buildings in historic districts and landscapes. Organized under the themes of 'Melding Contemporary and Historic Design', 'Design Standards in Changing Environments', 'Modernism and Post modernism in Preservation Design', and 'Engineering and Preservation', issues of compatibility are explored through diverse projects in locations across the United States from historic Charleston, SC to downtown Los Angeles.

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
