Lay out your pages in order, with page one on the left leading to the last page on the right. Starting from the last page, apply glue along an inch-wide strip on the leftmost edge of the page. Then, lay the preceding page over this glued edge and smooth it down. Repeat until all the pages are connected.

Use a ruler to draw a line from top to bottom of the front cover, about 1/4" (6.3 mm) from the spine. Make two marks on this line, one 1/4" (6.3 mm) down from the top of the book, the other 1/4" (6.3 mm) up from the bottom. Now, divide the distance between these marks into thirds and mark the two middle points. 2
