Discussion A good article will restate the results again in plain language and state whether they are consistent with the expected findings. Do the authors overstate their findings? That is, if the results were inconsistent or small effect sizes, are the authors making too much of them?

The theoretical framework you describe should guide your study throughout the paper. Be sure to always connect theory to the review of pertinent literature and to explain in the discussion part of your paper how the theoretical framework you chose supports analysis of the research problem or, if appropriate, how the theoretical framework was found to be inadequate in explaining the phenomenon you were investigating.
